

## **Community Based Project Requirements**

# **Project Purpose**

This project is designed to engage students in addressing real-world rural challenges while developing leadership, advocacy, and problem-solving skills. Each student will work with a community mentor to identify an issue, contribute to an initiative, and document the impact.

## **Project Requirements**

#### 1. Identify a Rural Issue

 Choose a challenge affecting your local community related to agriculture, rural development, or economic sustainability.

### 2. Engage with the Community

- Collaborate with a local leader, mentor, or organization to gather insights and implement your project.
- Meet with your mentor at least twice for guidance and feedback.
- Either create a new project plan or contribute to an existing community effort.
- Ensure your involvement supports meaningful progress and measurable outcomes.

#### 3. Document Your Work

- Keep track of steps taken, challenges faced, and community engagement efforts.
- Collect data, testimonials, or observations that demonstrate the project's impact.

## 4. Submit a Final Report

- Summarize your project's purpose, participation, outcomes, and reflections.
- o A final paper or portfolio will be accepted as documentation.
- Must be approved by a faculty member before submission.

# **Important Deadlines & Expectations**

- Project must be completed during the Fall 2025 semester
- Project outlines must be submitted for approval by October 15, 2025
- Students will submit final report/portfolio/presentation of work by **December 31, 2025.**
- Failure to complete the project will result in ineligibility to attend the Outlook Forum in Washington D.C. in February 2026
- Examples of projects include, but are not limited to, participating in the planning of a community event, providing a community service project, conducting a community needs assessment or teaching agriculture lessons to local elementary students.
